Pizza delivery man remains critical

Two charged in brutal beating

Three felony charges were filed Saturday against two men for Thursday's assault and robbery of a Domino's Pizza employee in the 1200 block of St. Mary's Boulevard.

Bail for Ronald Bell Jr., 25, Jefferson City, and Patrick Middaugh, 17, Kansas City, has been set at \$500,000 each.

They are charged with first-degree assault and robbery as well as armed

criminal action.

Alan McCullough, 35, Jefferson City, remained in critical condition Saturday at the University of Missouri-Columbia Hospital, after he was struck on the head and chest multiple times with a piece of pipe.

Cole County Prosecutor Bill Tackett said, "obviously, we would upgrade the charges if necessary."

Jefferson City police said the two

men charged Saturday used a pay phone at the Break Time convenience store, 1200 Missouri Blvd., to order pizza delivered to an unoccupied house in the 1200 block of St. Mary's Boulevard.

In a separate, older case:

Marcus Smith, 21, Jefferson City, has been charged with first-degree assault and robbery, as well as armed

criminal action from a June 2 incident in the 300 block of East Dunklin Street.

Bond has been set at \$500,000.

Smith and Antohisha Hickman, 21, Jefferson City, had been charged in St. Charles County with two felony drug charges of possession of controlled substances with the intent to distribute.

Curtis West Jr., 25, Jefferson City, was shot once in the face and once in the chest at his home in the 300 block of East Dunklin Street.

Hickman was charged in Cole County with aiding Smith, by driving him to St. Peters in St. Charles County.
