

Eugene man faces charges in shooting

A Eugene man is facing life in prison if convicted on charges he's facing for allegedly shooting a woman early Thursday morning.

The Cole County Prosecutor's office has filed charges against Glenn Ford, 48, that include first-degree assault, armed criminal action and unlawful use of a weapon.

Cole County sheriff's deputies got the call around 1 a.m. from an adult female who said she had been shot at a residence at 16316 Berry Street. The woman had gone to 10404 High Street and was found to be suffering from multiple gunshot wounds to her legs.

According to the probable cause statement from the sheriff's department, Ford and the victim had been in a romantic relationship for about one year. The weapon used was a .22 caliber rifle.

A second female victim was apparently shot at, but avoided injury by seeking cover.

Deputies and members of the Highway Patrol went back to the home on Berry street, where the suspect was located, and surrounded it. They eventually made a tactical entry and arrested the suspect.
